



2024 was a monumental year for Wings for Learning's ability to serve the greater Houston community and meet our mission for every student to love learning by providing academic intervention and support.



SCHOOL PARTNERSHIPS

Unlocking Opportunities for Growth and Excellence



- Wings for Learning provided dyslexia intervention to middle school and elementary students.
- Over the academic year, students improved reading levels by an average of 6 grades and experienced an average percentage increase of 121% on DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills) scores.



- Wings for Learning provides math intervention to 3rd-5th graders identified as at-risk and with low performing math STAAR and MAP scores.
- Students show an increase in classroom success and standardized testing performance.
